Pastor's Annual Letter

Dear Daniels' members, friends and guests,

The past two years have been a challenge for you and me. We have completed a new building, furnished it and started using it and offering it to our community in different ways. We have lived through a difficult time in the life of the church with controversial national church decisions about ordaining clergy who live in same-sex, committed relationships and also the possibility of recognizing the same relationships. We've endured the worst economic recession in our lifetimes. Giving to churches has suffered at all levels so budget adjustments have been painful and necessary. It hasn't been an easy or comfortable time to be the church.

But there has been a benefit for me and I hope for you as well. I've questioned God's purpose and call for the church; I've examined my call to ordained ministry and I've looked to you, the faithful of Daniels, and where I'm leading you. Most times I've known but sometimes I haven't been too sure. All this pain and uncertainty has created a new perspective for me that I share with you here. These difficult times and experiences have brought me back to my baptism and back to the basic mission of the church.

Throughout the past two years there has been a constant in our community that cannot be ignored and that is HUNGER. As a pastor and fire chaplain, I'm privileged to come in close contact with many people in our community. I'm invited into homes and people tell me the truth about their condition. One of the best indicators of family health and security is the refrigerator. I have seen lots of empty refrigerators in our community in the past two years. That means hungry children and adults. Adults usually have the means and mobility to find something to eat but children lack those resources. Children simply have to live with their hunger. Hungry children aren't acceptable in a country as wealthy and prosperous as the United States. Hungry children are not part of God's plan for this world. Hungry children are an affront to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and to the church. Jesus said, "Let the children come." Children were a priority for Jesus and hungry children are something we can do something about.

I call you to do more for hunger in 2011. I know we are faithful in giving food to Lincoln County Christian Ministry and to the "Back Pack" programs at Union Elementary and Norris

Childers Elementary but we can do more. We must do more to see that children right here in our midst don't go hungry. Maybe we can't fix everything in a child's life but we can see that they have enough to eat!

Help me to help Daniels Lutheran Church re-focus on what's important this year. Help each other and encourage each other to bring more food than we ever have when we gather food for various hunger programs. Remember your baptism and all God has done, is doing and will do for you and respond generously.

A Letter From The 2010 Council President

St. Paul writes: “We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.” (1st Thessalonians 1: 2-3)

When I read these words from St. Paul, I’m reminded of my church family and of our community of faith. Your work of faith and labor of love has expressed itself in many ways this past year. Your labor of love has helped raise funds to benefit people within our community with special health concerns. You have collected food for Lincoln County Christian Ministries along with a community garden that provided fresh vegetables. A benefit dinner was held to assist the Good Neighbor Shop. We supported our local schools with food for the children’s backpack program and hosted a dinner for the West Lincoln football team. Our youth participated in the food walk, worked at the soup kitchen and raised funds for Relay for Life. We had opportunities to minister together with the members of Crowell Methodist Church and Trinity Lutheran Church. With the labor of love and concern for these and other ministries we were still able to minister to the special needs and concerns of our own.

Our fellowship hall has given us many opportunities to serve our community. The monthly breakfasts gives us an opportunity to sit down and visit with our neighbors and friends and share the love of Christ. I’m thankful for the foresight and leadership that has been provided in organizing such a significant event of fellowship and ministry to our community.

It’s exciting to see the youth’s involvement in our ministry and especially the young adults taking leadership roles in our congregation.

As we begin a new year we find ourselves busier than ever. It seems that there is never enough time to get things done. I recently read an essay on time from the Monaghan Group. “There is enough time to do what is truly important...Do we have enough? Will we be enough? There is enough grace to treat people with respect and kindness, enough wisdom to solve our problems with honor and simplicity, enough trust to surrender to a destiny beyond our control and imagination, enough future to see beyond the fear, enough creativity to never feel stuck in the tried and true, enough breathing room to take a step back and re-think when we need to.

As we welcome and embrace 2011 we have national and international crises, fear and uncertainty. Even in life’s uncertainties we still have the love of God and the Holy Spirit to guide us through these times. You are “the Church.” I thank God for each of you and the ministry and love you provide for one another and our community of faith.

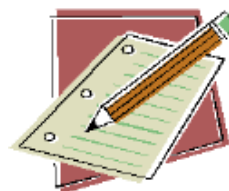

CEMETERY SUBCOMMITTEE

CEMETERY REGULATIONS – Adopted by Daniels Congregation, 1989

There will be no coping (curbing) used in the cemetery.

Any coping already in use will be removed if possible.

ELIGIBILITY REGULATIONS FOR BUYING A GRAVESITE – Adopted, May, 1986

Non-members - \$1,100

Inactive members (according to the bylaws of Daniels congregation) - \$350

Active members (according to the bylaws of Daniels congregation) - \$50

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS – approved, April, 1978

1. Approval must be secured from the cemetery subcommittee or pastor before
 - A. a grave is opened.
 - B. a marker is erected.
 - C. an alteration is made to an existing marker.
2. No grave is to be opened until payment is made to the cemetery subcommittee unless special permission is given by the subcommittee.
3. A VAULT IS MANDATORY!
4. Excessive dirt is NOT TO BE DUMPED at the edge of the woods. Excess dirt should be hauled off or used to
 - A. fill in low places in the cemetery.
 - B. fill in sunken graves.
 - C. be placed in an area close to the outdoor worship center.
5. Only grass will be put in the cemetery around the graves. There shall be no curbing, sand, gravel, concrete, shrubs, etc.
6. All vehicles, including trucks hauling monuments, shall drive only in designated driveways.
7. If it is necessary to remove a stone already in place in order to open a grave, the old stone should be replaced in its proper place EVEN with the top of the ground.
8. Regulations regarding stones and markers:
 - A. NO footstones are allowed in Plat B. In the old section and in Plat A. footstones are allowed ONLY if there is a solitary marker that bears just the family name.
 - B. Upright markers may still be placed in the old section and in Plat A. A concrete extension may be used around the base.
 - C. ONLY flat stones with a concrete extension are to be used in Plat B. There will be no exceptions to this rule.
 - D. All flat stones are to be even with the top of the ground and may have a concrete extension around them. The concrete extension is not compulsory.

(Please see next page for additional regulations regarding plot ownership and flowers/decorations)

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS REGARDING PLOT OWNERSHIP – adopted, 1997

1. The church will not purchase any unused plots.
2. Plots that are left vacant for three generations will be returned to the church for future use.
3. Anyone having plots that are not designated for use are asked to return them to the church for future use.
4. Should owners of plots wish to sell their plots, it is requested that it be sold to a member or member connection.

FLOWER RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR CEMETERY – adopted, 2005

1. No breakable materials allowed in cemetery including but not limited to glass, ceramics, clay pots, etc.
2. Family or their designee should remove funeral flowers within two weeks after a funeral. (Please take large quantities to convenience sites.)
3. Seasonal decorations – should be removed 2 weeks after Holiday.
4. Clean up days – All wanted flowers and containers must be removed by:
March 1
August 1
December 1
and may be replaced on or after the Sunday following the cleanup day.
5. No herbicides (Round-Up or weed/grass killers) may be used in Cemetery except where grass grows in joints, not edge next to dirt.

SOCIAL MINISTRY COMMITTEE

The Social Ministry Committee shall have general oversight of all the outreach ministries of the congregation. They shall lead us in ministry to social organizations such as Christian Ministries, The Good Neighbor Shop and others. They shall coordinate the ELCA Hunger program. They shall also coordinate nursing home ministries and our concern for the shut-ins.

The outreach activities of Daniel's social ministry provide each of us an opportunity, not only to see firsthand the effects such efforts have on the needs of the community, but also occasions for us to get others involved. Invite a friend, invite a neighbor!

The Christian Ministry of Lincoln County

The Christian Ministry is an interdenominational organization seeking to serve, in cooperative effort, the needy of our community. The ministry maintains a referral service, soup kitchen, food pantry, prison ministry and other assistance agencies. A sizable portion of the food for the food closet and soup kitchen comes directly from donor churches. Money for operations and emergency needs also comes from area churches. Without food collection and donations by these churches, this ministry would not be possible in its current form and reach. The Christian Ministry of Lincoln County does not operate with excess and truly makes very little go quite a long way. If you are interested in learning more, the telephone numbers for the offices are 704-732-0383 and 704-732-2691.

Daniels is responsible for food collection and donation for the months of *April and October*. In addition, we were also called upon to adopt one food item during the month of *December*. Daniels chose macaroni and cheese. Approximately 300 boxes of mac-and-cheese were donated by our congregation. The food items from these collection periods go to the food pantry and are subsequently packed into boxes distributed to people that may otherwise go hungry. In 2010, the generosity of our congregation helped provide food and sustenance for people in need. Participation was good and is sincerely appreciated. Reminders will be announced and posted in the bulletin.

Non-perishable food items that are needed in the food pantry include:

- i Canned food (beans, vegetables, soups, meats, dumplings, fruit, applesauce, etc.)
- i Boxed pasta and mac-n-cheese products
- i Saltine crackers
- i Breakfast cereals, oatmeal, and grits
- i Dried peas and beans
- i Peanut butter
- i Flour
- i Powdered milk and instant potatoes
- i Canned or condensed juices (that do not require refrigeration)
- i Rice

Other items needed in the food pantry that are often overlooked include:

- i Laundry detergent
- i Toilet paper
- i Bar soap
- i Toothpaste
- i Toothbrushes

Daniels also provides volunteers for packing boxes in the food pantry for distribution. In 2010, the days for Daniels volunteers fell in *mid-August*. Participation was wonderful. Turnout included members of all age groups as well as several folks from the community who saw the notice in the paper and just wanted to help.

Thank you for volunteering. The work isn't hard, and you get a lot of satisfaction from it. If you are interested in volunteering, the box-packing activity runs from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. Lunch is provided from the soup kitchen. Two or three volunteers are needed per day. As the upcoming year's dates approach, reminders will be announced and posted in the bulletin.

For the past several years, Daniels has participated in the Christian Ministry's program to collect toys for children at Christmas. Thus, our Jesse Tree was born. Once again this year, Daniels rose to the challenge, collecting a mini-van load of toys for children of all age groups. These were delivered to the Christian Ministry on December 13 in time for distribution for Christmas. **Thank you to all who made a child's Christmas special.**

The Good Neighbor Shop

The Good Neighbor Shop is a Christian-inspired cause that includes interested churches in Lincoln County. It was established to collect quality used clothing to sell at a low price for those with special needs. Assistance is given without charge to victims of fire, other catastrophes, and to other in need. These people must bring a written note from Social Services, Christian Ministries, a pastor, a school teacher or principal, or a member of the board of the shop. The shop's telephone number is 704-732-1835. Vicky Lewis and Beth Cain are Daniels' representatives on The Good Neighbor Shop Board of Directors.

Some of the items needed by the Good Neighbor Shop are:

- i Laundry detergent (to clean the donated clothing prior to sale)
- i Disinfectant cleaners (such as Pine-Sol and Lysol)
- i Scrub brushes, mops, and toilet brushes
- i Cleaning gloves
- i Clothing in good condition
- i Household items

STEWARDSHIP AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

In accordance with the Bylaws, the Stewardship and Finance Committee has general oversight for the financial life of the congregation. They prepare and publicize an annual budget and coordinate responses through pledging and giving. This committee maintains a Memorial subcommittee which keeps a separate fund. They coordinate all investments, audits and insurance programs.

God has blessed us with Betty Leonard who has willingly served as records keeper, as well as treasurer for both the general fund and the building fund. These three positions have been rolled together and require many hours of labor. The committee is grateful to Betty for serving Daniels in this capacity.

From March to June, the Finance Committee met with three investment groups: Capital Concepts, WFG Investments, Inc. and Thrivent Financial about managing the Roof Fund. Guidelines were written for managing the fund. In June, WFG Investments, Inc was selected. The amount of money transferred to them for management was \$302,653.48.

In cases of members donating a gift in kind (a tangible gift other than money), a letter of donation was written and accepted as a means of tax deduction for gifts to Daniels Lutheran Church.

In August the committee met to prepare the 2011 budget. We used the statement of expenses from 2010 to recommend the 2011 budget with the exception of salaries. There were no salary increases for 2011. We did increase the Pastor's insurance compensation to reflect the amount he is paying for insurance.

Many thanks to those who serve in positions whose salary does not adequately reflect the high quality of service they provide for Daniels Lutheran Church.

WORSHIP AND MUSIC COMMITTEE

The Worship and Music Committee shall have general oversight for all that pertains to worship and music. They shall plan and implement all worship services of the congregation, including in their planning for Holy Communion, worship assistants, hymns, etc. They shall maintain all robes and worship materials. They shall provide for a nursery and for flowers at all appropriate services. They will also assist in the decorating for all special seasons, such as Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter.

The Worship and Music Committee has many sub-committees including: Thermostat Controllers, Communion Assistants, Ushers, Congregational Greeters, Altar Guild, Acolytes, Decorating Committee, Nursery Attendants, Lectors, and Sound System Operators.

The committee met three times last year. The year's planning began with Lent and Easter worship services including a pancake supper on Shrove Tuesday. The Daniels youth planned and led the Easter Sunrise Service and the Men in Mission cooked and served a delicious breakfast.

WEDDING POLICY STATEMENT

Approved by Daniels Congregation, 1997

In the planning of your wedding, it is important to remember that it is a worship service. The Wedding Service is an act of worship in which we praise God for His goodness and invoke His blessing upon your marriage. By choosing to have your wedding in the Church you are saying that this marriage is more than a civil, legal ceremony. You are affirming that marriage is a lifelong covenant between a man and a woman established and ordained by God. In choosing to be married in the Church you are asking that God bless your union and that your marriage be grounded in Christ. Therefore, care should be taken so that your wedding be conducted in the manner befitting a service of divine worship of the Triune God.

The pastor of Daniels will be the officiating minister for the wedding service unless otherwise requested. If you wish to have another pastor officiate, assist, or preach at the wedding service, please let the pastor know.

Music for the wedding service proper should be Christian in theme. It should bring praise to God and His divinely ordained marriage covenant. Music that is of a secular nature, such as the Wedding March, may be used for the processional and recessional prior to and after the worship service proper. Any solos sung within the worship service must be sacred or contemporary Christian music. If the Lord's Prayer is one of the solo selections, it will still be prayed by the whole congregation as part of the worship service since it is a prayer of the faithful to our Father.

If you wish for our church organist to play for your wedding, please ask her. Do not assume that she will play for your wedding. The amount of time spent in preparation for a wedding goes above and beyond her normal responsibilities as parish organist, and it is strongly recommended that she be adequately compensated for the time she spends preparing and playing for your wedding. An honorarium of \$50.00 or more is appropriate. If you wish to have a guest organist play for your wedding, please be polite and inform our church organist and pastor of your intentions.

You are responsible for the following items:

- i Picking out and paying for wedding bulletins and getting the bulletins to the secretary one week ahead of time.
- i Selecting from the forms of marriage vows given to you by the pastor. If you desire to write your own vows, they must be done in conjunction with the pastor.
- i Selecting the lessons from the suggested list of Bible passages appropriate for marriage given to you by the pastor.
- i Giving the pastor the list of names of the wedding party, guest book attendant, bridal coordinator, organist (if not church organist), lectors/readers of lessons, family members (parents of the bride/groom, grandparents of the bride/groom), musical selections, special guests. Make sure you have the correct spelling of these names.
- i Reserving the Fellowship Hall for the reception (you will need to contact Eric Sigmon for scheduling). The prices and regulation for use of our facilities are attached to the Wedding Policy statement.
- i Cleaning up the church facilities and grounds.
- i Contacting the Altar Guild to coordinate the decorating of the church.
- i Paying for the use of the pew candles.

You are required to attend two to four (2-4) pre-marital counseling sessions with the pastor. If you have a bridal coordinator/wedding director, please let the pastor know for they will need to work together in planning the actual wedding service. The pastor and the wedding couple will work out an understanding about the pastor's attendance at the rehearsal party and wedding reception.

You should bring your marriage license to the rehearsal along with a stamped envelope addressed to the Lincoln County Register of Deeds, PO Box 218, Lincolnton, NC 28093. The presiding minister is responsible for returning the signed marriage licenses to the Register of Deeds.

Photographs may be taken during the service as long as there is no flash. All flash photography must be done before or after the service, during the processional and recessional only. There will be no flash photography during the worship service.

The wedding service may be videotaped as long as the camera is stationary and does not interfere or detract from worship.

Daniels is a house of God and therefore should be treated with reverence.

- i Please do not use rice, but instead use birdseed and only outside the church.
- i Use only fresh cut flowers for the service.
- i Please do not move any fixtures or furniture in the church without the approval of the pastor.
- i Do not tape or tack wedding ornaments or bows to the pews, walls, or woodwork themselves.
- i Do not modify or remove worship decorations or materials without the prior approval of the pastor, Worship and Music Committee, and Property Committee.

We have read this policy and understand it and agree to abide by it.

DANIELS ELCA GUIDELINES FOR FACILITY USAGE

Adopted by Council Action 2009:

The Daniels ELCA Fellowship Hall, Youth Activity Center, Sanctuary, Property and Buildings are dedicated to the glory of God and the spreading of His Word.

These facilities are available for appropriate use by members of the congregation and community. Use of either facility is scheduled through: Eric Sigmon- Fellowship Hall, Gail Gilbert-Youth Activity Center, Pastor Bost- other buildings/grounds. These individuals are appointed by the Church Council and its Property Committee, which has final say in all property matters. A coordinator will be appointed to serve as liaison between the church and those using facilities. A master calendar for all facility usage and events is maintained on the church website at www.danielselca.org . Prior reservation for use shall be given precedence over subsequent requests, with the following exception: **Use of these facilities for church-wide religious services or funerals shall take priority over non-church functions.**

Members of Daniels ELCA may use the facilities at no cost. However, they are expected to clean or make arrangements to pay for cleaning of any facility used.

Those who are not members of Daniels who wish to use the Fellowship Hall must pay a non-refundable fee of \$300.00 at the time of reservation/application. Non-members who use the Youth Activity Center must pay a non-refundable fee of \$75.00 at the time of reservation/application. Non-members who use the Sanctuary must pay a non-refundable fee of \$200.00 at the time of reservation/application. Exceptions for non-payment of fees may be approved only by Church Council. Everyone who uses the facilities or grounds must complete an application/contract and agree to the terms listed. Everyone who uses the facilities is expected to practice good stewardship and maintain the cleanliness of our Church's resources. **These facilities are a part of God's House, and shall be treated with reverence and respect.**

Youth Activity Center Reservation Information and Rules

By Congregational Council Action January 11, 2009, the Parish House has been designated as a Youth Activity Center. The primary purpose of the Center is to serve as a home to the Youth Ministry of Daniels Lutheran Church. Though it may be used for other purposes, priority is given to Youth Activities.

If you wish to reserve the Youth Activity Center, the regulations are as follows:

1. Contact Gail Gilbert to make a reservation.
2. Arrange for a key and for the heat or a/c to be turned on and off.
3. Wash and/or replace all supplies you have used.
4. Clean and replace all tables and chairs.
5. Remove all decorations
6. Sweep all floors and mop, especially if a meal has been served.
7. Collect and remove all trash, including the rest room trash cans.
8. Clean the rest rooms.
9. Clean out opened, unused food from the refrigerator: otherwise, if left and/or not labeled, it will be either thrown out or used by anyone who follows after you.

Daniels Lutheran Church Child/Youth Protection Policy

In a continuing effort to protect the children and youth of Daniels Lutheran Church whenever children and youth are engaged in any church sponsored, supported or related activity, the Daniels Lutheran Church Council adopts the following policy:

1. Children or youth under the age of 18 will be supervised and cared for by church members who are 18 years old or older.
2. A child or youth under the age of 18 will not be alone with any adult except for the parent, guardian, or legal guardian of the child or youth. This applies at all church sponsored, supported and related activities including transportation to and from events.
3. New church members will regularly attend worship for six months prior to becoming involved in children/youth activities. During the second six months, the newly involved adult will work alongside another youth/child leader who will act as mentor.
4. Background checks will be completed triennially on paid church professionals and volunteers who have regular, ongoing contact with children and youth including church nursery attendants, Sunday School teachers and volunteers who are engaged in overnight activities with children and youth.
5. A Background Check Coordinator will be appointed by the Church Council. The Coordinator will maintain background check files in the church's file safe located in the pastor's parsonage office. The Background Check Committee will be comprised of the Christian Education Committee Chair, the Youth Committee Chair, the Background Check Coordinator and the Pastor. Strict confidentiality will be maintained.

DANIELS SENIOR LEAGUE

RULES OF CONDUCT

1. No profanity.
2. No practical jokes which can harm others or the property of others.
3. Do not approach strangers.
4. You must be escorted by an adult at all times.
5. If a League Leader prohibits something, then all leaders do.
6. You must remain with the group at **ALL** times.
7. Obey all general safety rules whether written or verbally stated.

RULES FOR PARTICIPATING IN LEAGUE EVENTS / OUTINGS / RETREATS

1. To be a member of the Sr. League, you do not have to be a member of Daniels. However, you must meet the requirements below:
 - A. You must attend at least **HALF** of the Sr. League meetings per year to participate in any out-of-town function.
 - B. You must pay dues. Dues are \$1.00 per month. (\$12.00 total for year.)
 - C. You must participate in the working and planning of the meetings, not just fun events. Your participation in these meetings will determine if you can go on outings and/or retreat.
 - D. To be eligible to go on the retreat, you must participate in **TWO** (2) service projects, and must participate in **ALL** retreat fundraisers unless excused by the leader.
2. Members must be in grades 6-12 or after graduation may participate until age 21 as a junior youth leader.
3. Drivers for youth events must be 25 years of age or older. Youth between the ages of 18 and 24 may drive themselves alone to events with the permission of their parents and the youth leaders.
4. Only active members may attend.
5. No guests are allowed on retreat or any overnight event.
6. Guests may attend outings or other events if approved through leaders and the youth committee.
7. You must have a signed release form and medical form for any out of town events and returned to a leader. This applies especially to guests.
8. You must exhibit Christian conduct and behavior. Remember, your behavior is a reflection on the Sr. League and the church.

Please realize that these guidelines are not all inclusive and that the League Leaders reserve the right to revise and extend these policies. In general, exercising good judgment will prevent occurrences which are not in the best interest of participants or the league events.

We, the undersigned, have carefully read the forgoing release, know the contents thereof, and sign it of our own free act. Any infraction of the above may necessitate the participant's parent/guardian being notified and the League Leaders determining an appropriate penalty which may include the participant being sent home at the parent/guardian's expense and/or suspended from future League activities.

Acolytes are responsible for having their robes clean and pressed before their first Sunday of service. The Christmas Eve candlelight service requires an additional acolyte. All the candles are to be lit one half hour before the service begins.

DECORATING COMMITTEE

The decorating committee is a sub-committee of the Worship and Music Committee. They are responsible for preparing the church for the Advent and Christmas seasons. They shall meet on the Saturdays prior to Christmas in order to make and hang wreaths, put up garland and bows, decorate windows, add candles, set up the manger scene, and oversee any other activities needed to prepare the church for the season. The decorating committee shall also meet after Christmas to remove candles and other decorations, polish the brass, and put the church back in order for regular church services.

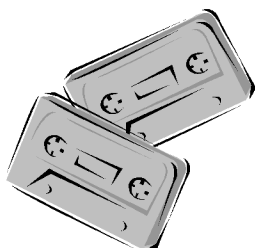
TAPE DUPLICATORS

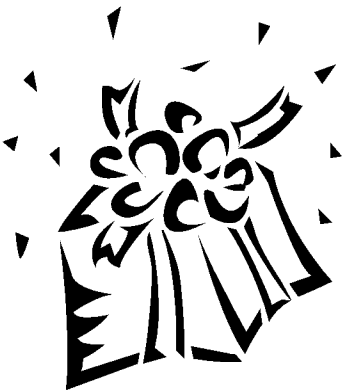

ALTAR FLOWERS

1. All flowers are given to the Glory of God. They may also be given in memory or in honor of persons or in commemoration of some special event.
2. Simplicity of design is imperative. Flowers should enhance the altar and not call attention to themselves.
3. Only fresh cut flowers should be used. Potted plants may be used occasionally, but not with bows or metallic paper. Artificial flowers are not to be used on the altar.
4. Flower arrangements of not more than two colors, plus greenery, are most attractive. The color of the flowers should never clash with the color of the paraments.
5. Flowers in the vases should not be taller than, conceal, or touch the cross.
6. Flowers should always be arranged in the choir room and never on the altar.
7. Always leave the brass vases on the altar. Remove only the liners and arrange the flowers in them. Under no circumstances should the brass vases be removed from the church and taken to the florist.
8. Please do not handle the brass with bare hands, use cloth or gloves.
9. Flower containers other than the brass may be used on the altar only with prior permission of the altar guild chairperson or the pastor.
10. Flowers are to be removed from the church as soon as possible after worship. Withered plants are never to remain on the altar. Appropriate usage for the flowers might be to take them to a nursing home, to a shut-in, to the sick of the congregation, to the cemetery, to the hospital, or give them to the person honored, or use them in any way you choose to provide a continuing spiritual ministry.
